Councilman Jose F. Moreno represents District 3, the north-central part of the city. In addition to his service on council, he is a professor at California State University, Long Beach; President of Los Amigos of Orange County, a community group that serves people in need; and most importantly a husband and father to four daughters.

Affordable Housing

Anaheim is an expensive place to live. Many residents live in overcrowded households and/or pay much of what they make toward housing. That leaves less for food, transportation, and health-related costs. In March, Council Member Moreno requested an agenda item to discuss affordable housing, or a lack of, in the city.

At the Oct. 24 City Council meeting, city staff presented various policies cities have adopted throughout the state and country. City staff also presented general concerns developers have over inclusionary housing policies. The Regional Housing Needs Assessment, a document revised every eight years, indicates that the Quantified Objective for Very Low Incomes was merely 83 units whereas Above Moderate Incomes was 3,872. Currently in its fourth year, the Regional Housing Needs Assessment shows that 119 permits were issued for Very Low Incomes and 4,714 permits were issued for Above Moderate Incomes. Council Member Moreno believes an ordinance is needed in our city and will work with Council Members Denise Barnes and Lucille Kring to develop a policy.

Quality Living

Anaheim residents deserve to live in a quality home. Recently many tenants have reached out to our office to share the poor living conditions they experience in their apartment complexes. Our office has collaborated with Code Enforcement to provide the necessary resources. If you are experiencing this at your apartment complex or know someone who is, please do the following:

- Take photos of the concerned area.
- Complete a work order through your property owner or manager. We advise that you make a copy of the work order.

If the property owner or manager is not responsive, call our Code Enforcement Division at (714) 765- 5158. They will be able to formally open a case and reach out to the property owner as well as inspect the units that are of concern.

Addressing Homelessness

The Homeless Policy Working Group will be finalizing its policy recommendations to City Council. Since August, the Working Group has done extensive research and heard from stakeholders regarding the condition of homelessness. The goal of these policies is to effectively and compassionately address homelessness in the city.

The last meeting will be on Friday, Nov. 3, at the Gordon Hoyt Conference Room in the Anaheim West Tower, beginning at 8:30 a.m. The proposed recommendations is expected to be presented to Council in December.
